Good Faith Effort Plan (GFEP) FAQs

- Q: Is the 20% SMWB goal mandatory?
 - A: No, but we ask prime contractors to do their best with good faith outreach efforts. If the goal is not met, proof of outreach efforts is required with the submittal.
- Q:What if I am having trouble finding SMWB subcontractors?
 - A: Please email the SMWVB Program Manager with the scopes of work you are seeking. You will receive lists of local SMWVB-certified firms to contact.
- Q:What if my business is SMWB-certified? Do I need to find SMWB subs?
 - A: If your firm is SMWVB-certified, you will most likely meet the goal. However, the GFEP is a required document, and a good faith outreach effort is still necessary.
- Q: Do I need to include all my subcontractors in the GFEP or just those that qualify towards the SMWB goal?
 - A: All subcontractors need to be included in the GFEP, even those that may not count towards the SMWB goal.



Prevailing Wage Rate and Labor Standards – Section 2.10 of the General Conditions

- Payroll records are subject to review
- Contractors to utilize LCP Tracker
- Certified payroll to be submitted on weekly basis
- Contractors are responsible for sub-contractor payroll
- Late payrolls delay contractor payments from SAWS
- Wage decisions are included within the specifications
- Site visits are random and unannounced
- Interviews will be conducted and will be private & confidential
- All apprenticeship programs will need to be approved by Department of Labor prior to starting



Supplemental Conditions

- Insurance requirements are found in Section 5.7 of the GCs
 - Installation Floater in lieu of Builder's Risk
 - Maintain insurance coverage during the construction of this Project
- Will ask for insurance prior to Board award to expedite execution of the contract
- Compliant prior to executing the contract

- Sealed bids are requested by the San Antonio Water System for the construction of approximately 1,908 linear feet (LF) of 42-inch and 434 LF of 10-inch sewer main via open-cut, 582 LF of 39-inch via Cured-In-Place Pipe (CIPP), and 535 LF of 42-inch via Jacking, Boring or Tunneling, abandonment of 935 LF of 39-inch sewer main, and associated manhole improvements for the Central Sewershed Package 7 Brackenridge High School (HS) Project, SAWS Job No. 18-4543.
- Project Fund will finance this expenditure included in the CY 2021
- Project is part of the Consent Decree (see Special Conditions)

Supplemental Conditions

- Worksite
 - No excavation work of any kind may begin until authorized by SAWS
 - Preliminary work such as televising, utility investigation/potholing, setup and testing of bypass pumping may not begin until approval in writing by SAWS
- Consent Decree Notice Provisions
 - Retention of documents
 - Notification of events that may cause delay
 - Liability for stipulated penalties
- Contractor shall perform the Work with its own organization on at least 40% of the total original contract price.
- Liquidated damages, for the purpose of this contract, will be assessed at \$632 per day.



Special Conditions

- Contractor to submit a completion report when the project is complete
 - Pre and post MPEG-I video and video logs
 - Any tests and/or submittals specified in the Contract Documents
- Payment
 - The unit price cost for items shall include all the necessary incidental work as subsidiary to the item unless otherwise specifically called out in the plans or approved by SAWS



Special Conditions

 Criminal History Background requirements for working on SAISD Property; contractor and subcontractors will need to obtain state and national criminal history background searches/checks on their employees who will have direct contact with students, refer to Special Conditions Document 00309.



Special Conditions

- Project milestones 395 days substantial completion, 30 days final completion, a total of 425 days
- COSA might require street closures during community events (Fiesta, etc.)
- Contractor shall anticipate "NO WORK PERIODS" prior to, during and after COSA and SAISD events. These events include FIESTA and STAAR Testing. Contractor shall submit a detailed work sequence schedule immediately after NTP to coordinate with COSA/SAISD
- Work near school Contractor shall coordinate with SAISD to ensure construction work does not impact the safety and integrity of the students, personnel, or any other individual withing SAISD property



Special Conditions

- Contractor shall coordinate with SAISD and BHS
 to ensure proper coordination for the closure of
 parking lots and driveways within school
 property, school traffic should flow in and out
 during construction of the project
- Recommended Construction Sequence Items I,
 2, & 3 are recommended to be constructed simultaneously and completed by Fall 202 I

- 1. Construct tunnels at three separate locations.
- 2. CIPP existing 39-inch brick pipeline.
- 3. Construct the 42-inch interceptor.
- 4. Activate the new 42-inch interceptor (Construct Tie-ins)
- 5. Restoration and paving.
- 6. Construct the 10-inch sanitary sewer lateral.



- Prior to commencing work, Contractor must submit and receive approval of the following:
 - Bypass plan
 - Traffic control plan
 - Pre-site video
 - Any lease agreements
 - Baseline Construction Sequencing Schedule
 - Employee background checks to be submitted to SAISD
- There will be one pre-construction meeting
 - Remaining submittals will be required at that time
- Contractor must submit a Work Progress Schedule within 10 days of NTP and monthly thereafter.



Permit Requirements

- All traffic control plans must be submitted to and approved by CoSA ROW as necessary for detours or other traffic impacts and signing.
- CoSA ROW permit to be acquired by the Contractor.
- Changes in the field that are cited by the CoSA ROW Inspector will require concurrence and approval from the SAWS Inspector first.
- Contractor is responsible for all other required permits per the General Conditions.
- Tree Permit to be obtained by SAWS



Permit Requirements

- All traffic control plans must be submitted to and approved by CoSA ROW as necessary for detours or other traffic impacts and signing. Contractor shall coordinate all necessary detours or other traffic impacts and signage with CoSA and SAISD.
- CoSA ROW permit to be acquired by the Contractor.
- Contractor shall coordinate all work with CoSA and SAISD.
- Changes in the field that are cited by the CoSA ROW Inspector or SAISD Representative will require concurrence and approval from the SAWS first.
- Contractor is responsible for all other required permits per the General Conditions.



Other Requirements

- All RFIs, RFPs, submittals, and any other items related to construction must be uploaded and processed through CPMS.
- No work can be performed by the Contractor unless the cost for that line item is on the contract or unless otherwise directed by SAWS.
- Any Change Orders will be based as identified under section 6.5 of the General Conditions.
- For bid items 1200, 1201, and 1202, the contractor shall coordinate his work at the earliest practical date after the contract has been awarded.



Other Requirements

- It is projected that construction will be impacted due to events such as STAAR Test, FIESTA, etc.
- Contractor shall obtain schedules on a regular basis (periodically) from CoSA and SAISD to coordinate and prepare for the events that will cause the "NO WORK PERIODS" throughout the construction of the project.
- Contractor shall provide updated construction schedule(s) reflecting the changes and updates of the NO WORK PERIODS.
- Contractor will not be compensated for the NO WORK PERIODS; Construction
 Claims for not working during the NO WORK PERIODS will not be accepted, reviewed
 nor considered.










Special Specifications: Allowance for relocation of existing utilities




PROP. 10" DIA. SANITARY SEWERLINE - 350 L.F.








