This addendum, applicable to work referenced above, is an amendment to the bid proposal, plans and specifications and as such will be a part of and included in the Contract Documents. RESPONSES TO QUESTIONS

1. Question: Can more information be given about the 3" electrical conduit needing to be temporarily rerouted? Ex. Length of conduit run, size of conductors, termination locations, etc.

Response: It is believed the 3" electrical conduit was installed as part of the original design of the pump station, and is abandoned.

2. Question: Has SAWS been able to stop water flow to allow for a dry work location?

Response: SAWS is presently isolating the water leakage to the site in advance of this project.

3. Question: We are working on the piping material for the Wurzbach Pump Station project and our Estimators have a few questions. Can we get a copy of sheet C-6? It is referenced in the specs but not included.

Response: The Please see detail K on sheet C-06 in the plan set.

4. Question: What is the pressure I need to design to? The TRD has a design pressure of 85PSI, 42-inch CSC Make and Lays document looks like it could be greater than 85

Response: Per Section 1.04.B.1 the design pressure shall be 150 psi.

5. Question: Is this project Domestic. Per Spec 01.60.00 1.10 D. Domestic products are required. I haven't seen a domestic requirement for a SAWS project like this. Will everything need to be domestic or will import material be allowed?

Response: Specifications Section 01 60 00 Product Requirements has been modified.

CHANGES TO THE SPECIFICATIONS

1. Remove Bid Proposal form in its entirety and replace with Bid Proposal form provided in this addendum.

Line 6 – Intermediate Demobilization and Remobilization has been updated. This version of the Bid Proposal should be utilized by Bidders when submitting a bid for this project. **Failure to use the revised version may result in the bid being found non-responsive.**

 - a. Paragraph 1.10: Delete subsection D.



Mobilization and Demobilization – This item shall govern the mobilization of personnel, equipment, and supplies at the project site in preparation for the beginning work on contract items and the acquisition of required permits. Mobilization shall include, but not be limited to, the movement of equipment, personnel, material, supplies, etc. to the staging area and the establishment of temporary offices, preparation of work plans and general submittals, secured staging area, temporary fencing and gates for the staging area, and establishment of other facilities necessary to the start of the work. It also includes bonds and insurance for the Work in accordance with the Contract Documents, complete in place. This item shall also include complete demobilization from the project site. Demobilization shall include, but not be limited to, the removal of equipment, personnel, material, supplies, temporary offices, temporary fences and gates, etc. from the staging area as well as site cleanup upon project completion. Each Intermediate Demobilization and Remobilization shall only be authorized upon a written directive from the Owner. Related Work shall include furnishing all labor, materials, tools, equipment, and incidentals required to demobilize for the Project, in accordance with the Contract Documents, complete in place.
