- Interested firms/contractors must RSVP to Stella Manzello via email at [Stella.Manzello@saws.org](mailto:Stella.Manzello@saws.org) to attend the site visit no later than September 13, 2021 at 4:00 p.m. The following information should be provided:
  - Company name
  - Name(s) of attendees
    - There is a limit of two (2) members per firm/contractor.
  - Request for a site visit time between 9:00 am and 4:00 pm on September 14, 2021.
- All parties must adhere to SAWS' COVID-19 Safety Procedures.
- The site visit duration is expected to be no more than 0.5 hour (30 minutes), excluding the drive time.
- There are to be **no** Q&A during the site visit, but contractors/firms may take videos, photos, and notes.
- Questions shall be submitted to Stella Manzello in writing via email to at [Stella.Manzello@saws.org](mailto:Stella.Manzello@saws.org).
- Questions will be addressed as required through addendum.

Procedures to follow if you plan to attend the site visit:

- Site visit will begin at the Turtle Creek No. 3 Pump Station. Arrive at the Turtle Creek No. 3 Pump Station located at 4641 Bluffcreek Drive, San Antonio, TX 78229 **20 minutes prior to the scheduled site visit time.**
- **No later than 9:00 a.m. on September 14<sup>th</sup> each attendee who sent a RSVP shall email Stella Manzello at [Stella.Manzello@saws.org](mailto:Stella.Manzello@saws.org) with responses to the following questions:**
  - Are you experiencing any symptoms such as fever, cough, loss of taste or smell, or any other COVID-19 related symptoms?
  - Have you tested positive for COVID-19 in the past 14 days?
  - Have you been into close contact with anyone in the past two weeks that has tested positive for COVID-19?
- **Attendees who answer yes to any of the questions, shall not attend the site visit.**
- A mask and safety eyewear must be worn at all times by all attendees. Safety mask must cover mouth and nose at all times.
- Attendees must maintain social distancing, minimum of 6-feet apart, from other attendees at all times.
- All attendees shall review the SAWS safety mask guidelines attached.
- Attendees will not be escorted by SAWS personnel and should not stray.

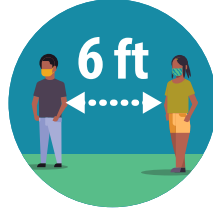
# Important Information About Your Cloth Face Coverings

As COVID-19 continues to spread within the United States, CDC has recommended additional measures to prevent the spread of SARS-CoV-2, the virus that causes COVID-19. In the context of community transmission, CDC recommends that you:



**Stay at home as much as possible**



**Practice social distancing (remaining at least 6 feet away from others)**



**Clean your hands often**



**In addition, CDC also recommends that everyone wear cloth face coverings when leaving their homes, regardless of whether they have fever or symptoms of COVID-19. This is because of evidence that people with COVID-19 can spread the disease, even when they don't have any symptoms.** Cloth face coverings should not be placed on young children under age 2, anyone who has trouble breathing, or is unconscious, incapacitated, or otherwise unable to remove the mask without assistance.

## How cloth face coverings work

Cloth face coverings may prevent the person wearing the mask from spreading respiratory droplets when talking, sneezing, or coughing. If everyone wears a cloth face covering when out in public, such as going to the grocery store, the risk of exposure to SARS-CoV-2 can be reduced for the community. Since people may spread the virus before symptoms start, or even if people never have symptoms, wearing a cloth face covering may protect others around you. Face coverings worn by others may protect you from getting the virus from people carrying the virus.



## General considerations for the use of cloth face coverings

When using a cloth face covering, make sure:

- The mouth and nose are fully covered
- The covering fits snugly against the sides of the face so there are no gaps
- You do not have any difficulty breathing while wearing the cloth face covering
- The cloth face covering can be tied or otherwise secured to prevent slipping



Wash your cloth face covering after each use in the washing machine or by hand using a bleach solution. Allow it to completely dry.

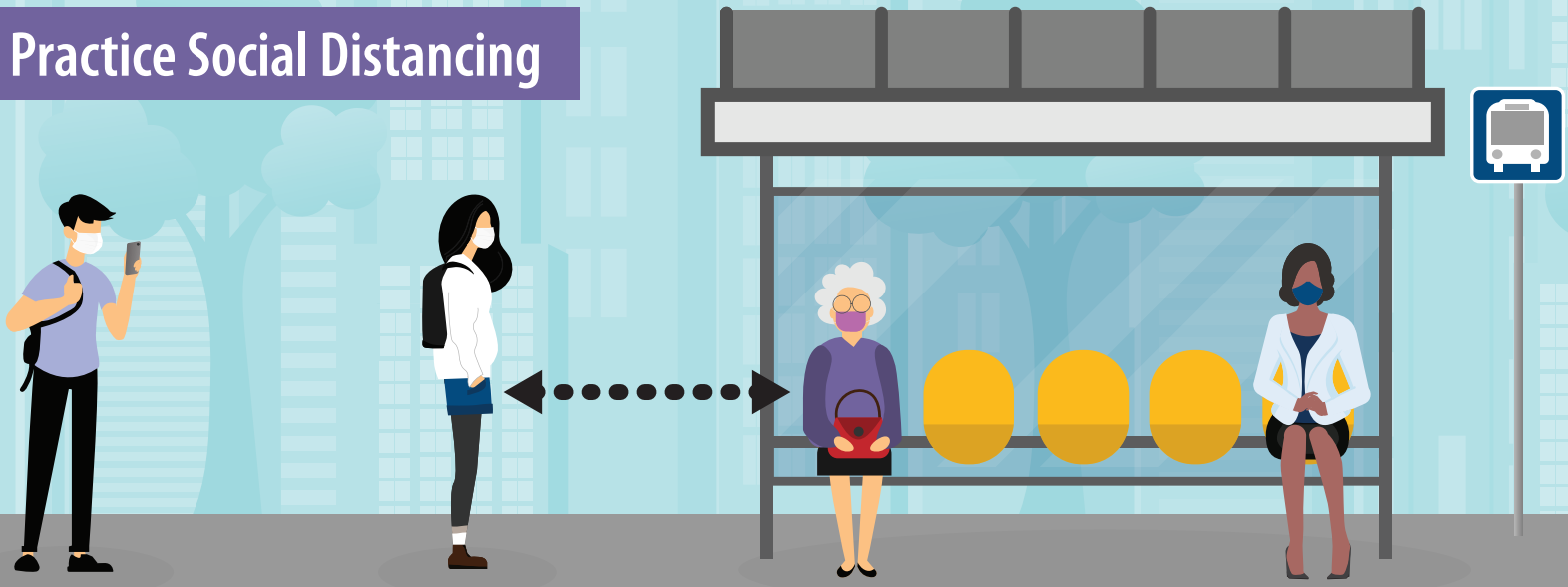
